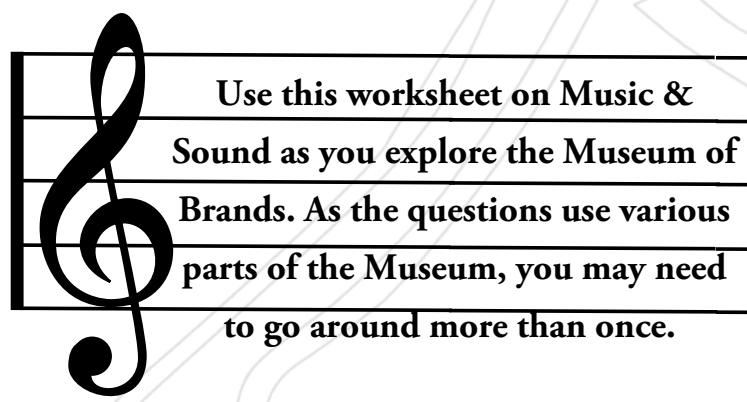

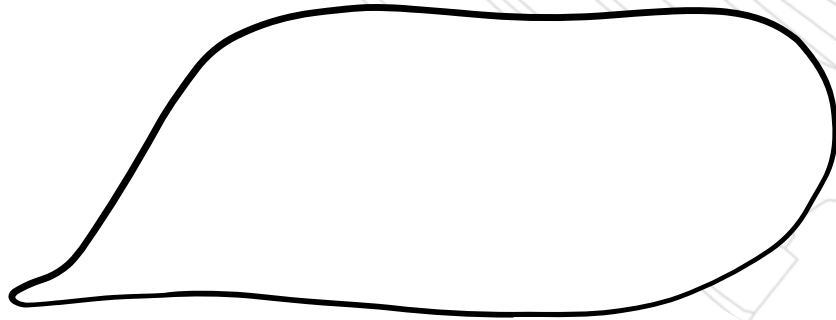
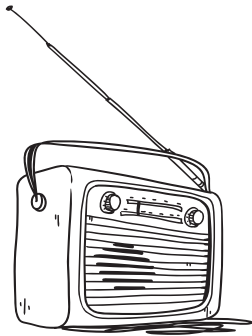

a) Can you match the flag with the correct musical tradition?



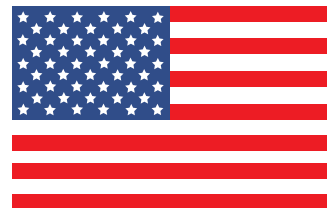

Which musicians and songs can you see? Decorate the records with the designs and colours of your favourites!



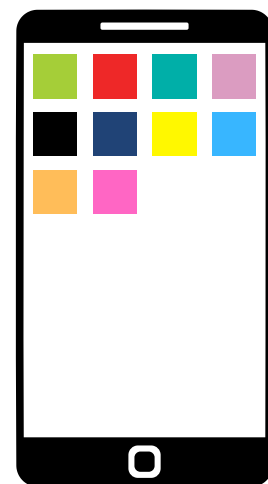
7. Can you spot the 'phones around the home' poster when you get to the 1970s?
