a.) Can you draw an example of bright and eye-catching packaging from the 1950s. Make sure to use lots of colour.




a.) Can you design your own space scene below using pictures from the products and packaging in the space cases?





5. In the 60s and 70s lots of funky new patterns and designs started to appear on clothes. How many can you spot?


a.) Find a pattern you like and use it to decorate this pair of boots!
